# NOTIFICATION TO BE SENT TO AN APPLICANT WHEN A LOCAL PLANNING AUTHORITY REFUSE PLANNING PERMISSION OR GRANT IT SUBJECT TO CONDITIONS

#### Appeals to the Secretary of State

- If you are aggrieved by the decision of your local planning authority to refuse permission for the proposed development or to grant it subject to conditions, then you can appeal to the Secretary of State under section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.
- Appeals must be made using a form which you can get from the Secretary of State at Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN (Tel: 0303 444 5000) or online at https://acp.planninginspectorate.gov.uk.
- The Secretary of State can allow a longer period for giving notice of an appeal but will not normally be prepared to use this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
- The Secretary of State need not consider an appeal if it seems to the Secretary of State
  that the local planning authority could not have granted planning permission for the
  proposed development or could not have granted it without the conditions they imposed,
  having regard to the statutory requirements, to the provisions of any development order
  and to any directions given under a development order.

#### **PURCHASE NOTICES**

If either the Local Planning Authority or the First Secretary of State refuses permission to develop land or grants it subject to conditions, the owner may claim that he/she can neither put the land to a reasonably beneficial use in its existing state nor can he/she render that land capable of a reasonably beneficial use by carrying out of any development which has been or would be permitted.

In these circumstances, the owner may serve a Purchase Notice on the District Council in whose area the land is situated. This notice will require the Council to purchase his interest in the land in accordance with the provisions of Part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990.

#### STRICT ACCORDANCE WITH PLANS

1. The development shall be carried out in strict accordance with the details shown on the approved drawings numbered NPS-DR-B-(10)-004 Rev P1 and 15-3-1673 03 Rev R and the documents entitled 'Validation Checklist and Planning Statement' (dated 22nd January 2016) and the 'School Travel Plan Template' except as varied by the conditions below.

REASON: To ensure that the development is carried out in accordance with the approved details.

2. The landscaping scheme outlined in the email from David Cox dated 25th November 2015 shall be maintained for a period of five years. Any trees, plants or grassed areas, or replacement of it, that is removed, uprooted, destroyed or dies within five years of the date of planting shall be replaced with the same or similar species in the same location.

REASON: To protect the character and appearance of the local landscape in accordance with Policy DVS2 of the North Devon Local Plan.

3. Within 3 months of the date of this decision, the profiled aluminium roof shall be painted Slate Grey in accordance with the specifications and details given in the 'Validation Checklist & Planning Statement' (dated 22nd January 2016) and on the drawing numbered 15-3-1673 03 Rev R.

REASON: To protect the character and appearance of the Bishops Tawton Conservation Area in accordance with Policy ENV16 of the North Devon Local Plan.
